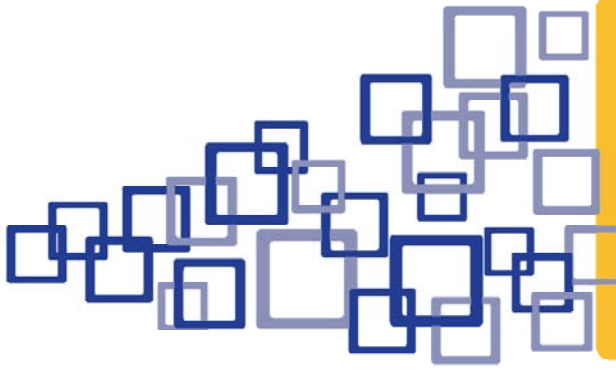

Success By 6 is...

- An early childhood development initiative that works to ensure that all children birth to age 6 have the positive and enriching experiences necessary to successfully begin school prepared to succeed.
- A partnership between the United Way of Central Indiana, the City of Indianapolis, and the Annie E. Casey Foundation.
- Joined by 40 Leadership Council members, more than 20 community partners, and over 100 volunteers.

We want to increase...

- Parents' understanding of the role they play in their child's learning.
- Children who receive health screenings through a well-child visit.
- Children are read to every day by a parent or familiar adult.
- Communication between teachers, caregivers, and parents about young children's development and needs.
- Quality and accessibility of high-quality early care and education programs.

And ultimately impact...

- Children's health status.
- Children meeting appropriate social, emotional, language and cognitive milestones.
- Families and primary caregivers having the support they need so that their children develop successfully.
- Residents, policymakers, and institutions understanding and supporting early childhood development.
- Coordination of services for young children and their families.

We address today's needs with...

- *Born Learning*, which reduces future community needs by improving communication between parents and children. We provide materials that inspire parents to turn everyday moments into teachable moments.
- *Imagination Library*, which reduces future community needs by improving early literacy. Any child under age 5 can be registered for the program and receive on free book per month by mail to be read to them by their parents.
- High-impact projects that support community-based childcare and preschool providers in their missions to deliver high-quality early childhood education. We are also helping build relationships between schools, parents, and providers to support children's transition to kindergarten.

So far we've reached...

- More than 500 schools, clinics, child cares, and other child-focused institutions with information about Success By 6 and its programs.
- More than 7,500 families with Born Learning materials.
- More than 13,000 children with Imagination Library who receive a free book every month.
